Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

For the six-month period ended June 30, 2023, the NBI Precious Metals Fund's Investor Series units returned -2.91% compared to -2.96% for the Fund's blended benchmark. The broad-based index, the S&P/TSX Gold Index (CAD), returned 0.38%. Unlike the indices, the Fund's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Fund's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

The Fund's net asset value dropped by 6.45% over the period, from \$24.12 million as at December 31, 2022 to \$22.56 million as at June 30, 2023.

During the first quarter, there was a great deal of ongoing market volatility driven by China's exit from COVID-19 lockdowns, interest rate fluctuations, and foreign bank challenges. The price of gold ended the first quarter at almost USD 2,000 per ounce compared with about USD 1,850 at the beginning of the quarter. The price increase was likely due to concerns about the banking issues in the United States—with Silicon Valley Bank—and Europe—with Credit Suisse. Investors view gold as a safe haven asset when uncertainty reigns in the banking system. Both gold and silver prices approached 2020 highs.

Gold and silver prices declined 3% and 5%, respectively, in the second quarter, and the S&P/TSX Global Gold/Silver Indexes were down, respectively, 10% and 21%. The price of gold closed the period at USD 1,919 per ounce after peaking at USD 2,050 on May 4th. Silver also peaked on the same day at USD 26.05 per ounce, up 9% since January 1st. The price of silver then declined 13% to the end of the June.

Under these circumstances, the Fund outperformed its benchmark.

Significant contributors to performance were Wheaton Precious Metals Corp. and Kinross Gold Corp. Wheaton's most recent quarterly results were in line with expectations, and we believe the market continues to reward Wheaton's low-risk business model coupled with its visible growth plan. Kinross's share price responded positively to higher commodity prices. While Kinross has some cost challenges, we think that its production results, shareholder returns, and future projects contributed to the share price appreciation.

There were two notable detractors from performance in the period: MAG Silver Corp. and Marathon Gold Corporation. MAG's quarterly results were below consensus expectations largely due to higher costs at its Juanicipio operation in Mexico. Marathon Gold continued to build out its Valentine project, an open-pit development project in early development in Newfoundland and Labrador. Production is anticipated to begin in 2025.

Recent Developments

We did not add any new companies to the portfolio during the period. We exited the position in Marathon Gold Corporation as the company still requires significant development work and capital to reach completion of a project in Newfoundland and Labrador. We prefer owning companies that are in production or very close to production.

We continue to focus on investing in either precious metal companies with established production and lower-cost operations or diversified royalty/streaming companies that typically have lower operational risk. Given the ongoing commodity price volatility, we have a natural bias towards larger capitalization companies.

On May 1, 2023, the Fund's independent review committee (the "IRC") was increased to four members when Stéphanie Raymond-Bougie was appointed as an IRC member.

Related Party Transactions

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Fund are as follows:

Trustee, Custodian, and Registrar

Natcan Trust Company ("NTC"), a direct or indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, is the Fund's trustee. In this capacity, it is the legal owner of the Fund's investments.

NTC acts as registrar for the Fund's securities and the names of securityholders. NTC also acts as the Fund's custodian. The fees for NTC's custodial services are based on the standard rates in effect at NTC.

Agent for securities lending transactions

NTC acts as the agent for securities lending transactions acts on behalf of the Fund in administering securities lending transactions entered into by the Fund. NTC is an affiliate of the Manager.

Fund Manager

The Fund is managed by National Bank Investments Inc. ("NBII"), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank. Therefore, NBII provides or ensures the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund's current operations, including investment consulting, the arrangement of brokerage contracts for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, bookkeeping and other administrative services required by the Fund.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund other than its "Fund costs" (defined below) (the "variable operating expenses"), in exchange for the Fund's payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Fund.

The administration fees are equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Fund, calculated and paid in the same manner as the Fund's management fees. The variable operating expenses payable by the Manager include, but are not limited to: transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; custodial costs; accounting and valuation fees; audit fees and legal fees; costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, simplified prospectuses, annual information forms, Fund Facts, continuous disclosure material and other securityholder communications; and costs of trustee services relating to registered tax plans, as applicable.

In addition to administration fees, the Fund shall also pay certain Fund costs, namely: taxes (including, but not limited to, GST/HST and income taxes); costs of compliance with any changes to existing governmental or regulatory requirements introduced after August 1, 2013; costs of compliance with any new governmental or regulatory requirements, including any new fees introduced after August 1, 2013; interest and borrowing costs; costs related to external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as at August 1, 2013; Independent Review Committee costs, including compensation paid to IRC members, travel expenses, insurance premiums and costs associated with their continuing education; and variable operating expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Fund.

The Manager may, from time to time and at its sole discretion, decide to absorb a portion of a series' management fees, administration fees or Fund costs.

As described under the heading *Management Fees*, the Fund pays annual management fees to NBII as consideration for its services.

Portfolio Manager

The Manager has appointed National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, as the portfolio manager for the Fund. A flat fee is payable annually to NBT for its management services.

Distribution and Dealer Compensation

NBII acts as principal distributor for the Fund. In this capacity, NBII buys, sells and swaps securities through Bank branches and the National Bank Investments Advisory Service in Canadian provinces and territories, and through external registered representatives. Fund securities are also offered by National Bank Financial Inc. (including its division National Bank Direct Brokerage), CABN Investments (a division of NBII) and other affiliated entities. Brokers may receive, depending on the distributed series, a monthly commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by their clients.

Brokerage Fees

The Fund may pay broker's commissions at market rates to a corporation affiliated with NBII. The brokerage fees paid by the Fund for the period are as follows:

Registered Plan Trust Services

NTC receives a fixed amount per registered account for services provided as trustee for registered plans.

Administrative and Operating Services

The provision of certain services was delegated by the Fund Manager, NBII, to National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of the Bank. These include accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The fees incurred for these services are paid to NBT by the Fund manager.

Management Fees

The Fund pays annual management fees to the Fund manager for its management services. The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the Fund's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. Under the *Distribution* heading, expenses include the broker's compensation consisting of the maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. Under the *Other* heading, the fees relate mainly to investment management, investment advisory services, general administration and profit. The breakdown of major services provided in consideration of the management fees, expressed as an approximate percentage of the management fees is as follows:

Past Performance

Past performance of a series of a Fund does not necessarily indicate how it will perform in the future.

Annual Returns
